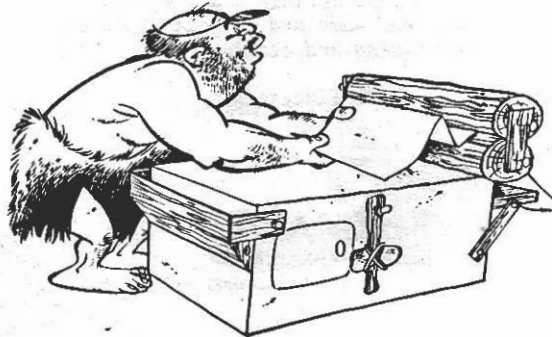



SECURITY IN THE COMMUNITY IS ...GOOD NEIGHBORS

Do you know your neighbors? If you do you have already taken a step towards preventing crime. Unfortunately our new community is not immune to crime, so we must all take steps to protect our families and properties.

The purpose of the security committee is to reduce criminal activity through neighborhood involvement supported by positive and effective law enforcement. The implementation and promotion of 'Neighborhood Watch' and 'Block Parent' are two ways that we as a community can protect ourselves and those we love, however, your full participation is required to make them effective.

Neighborhood Watch requires mutual assistance among neighbors to watch out for one another in order to reduce crimes such as burglaries and vandalism.

Block Parent is a program designed to provide a safe place for children to go when they are in danger or need of help. The participants in such a program are volunteers who are strictly screened by the police so that we can be insured our children will be safe.

If you want to make our new community a safer place to live by establishing the Neighborhood Watch and Block Parent Programs, talk to your neighbors and plan to attend a meeting on February 19th at 7:30 p.m. at the Queenswood Community Centre.
