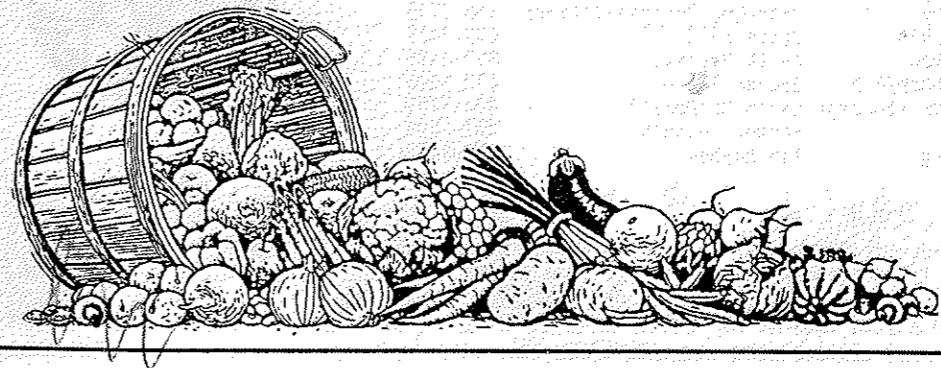

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I would like to extend a hardy welcome to everyone who has recently taken up residence East of the Tenth Line. My name is Peter McNamara and I am President of your local community association.

For those with no previous exposure to community associations, we are a group of residents who have volunteered to act as a focal point for coordinating social and recreational activities. We also represent the area when dealing with Cumberland Township and other groups in matters of general concern (e.g. schooling, postal issues, urban planning, etc.).

To this latter point, I wish to personally report that various home owners have obtained lower property tax assessments as a result of appeal notices that were filed earlier this year. Specifically, two Great Gulf models (Brandon and Churchill) have had their fair market values lowered by \$4,000 and \$8,000 respectively. After discussion with the Regional Assessment Review Board, it was agreed that next year all residents with these models will have their assessments automatically lowered.

Your association is also attempting to get a clear understanding of the "Fair Market Value" calculation that is used for developing assessments. I hope to report more on this issue in the next newsletter. Meanwhile, if you know of any other models that have been reassessed, please let me know so that we can ensure that all of our community can benefit from your efforts.

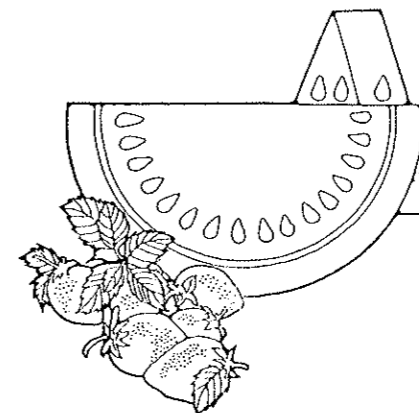
RECREATION REPORT

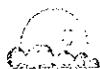


THE WEATHER HAS NOT BEEN COOPERATING WITH OUR TOT PLAYGROUND CONSTRUCTION AND CONSEQUENTLY IT MAY APPEAR AS THOUGH WE HAVE LOST INTEREST, BUT FEAR NOT, JUST AS SOON AS ITS DRY ENOUGH TO GET SOME MACHINERY IN THERE THE MUNICIPALITY WILL FINISH THE JOB.HOPEFULLY BY THE TIME THIS BULLETIN IS DELIVERED MANY OF YOU WILL HAVE SEEN THE FINAL PRODUCT IN USE.THE RECREATION COMMITTEE INVITES YOUR COMMENTS.

THE RECREATION COMMITTEE IS CURRENTLY WORKING TOWARDS TWO MAJOR OBJECTIVES.THE FIRST IS THE PLANNING FOR AN OUTDOOR RINK THIS COMING WINTER.OUR TENTATIVE PLAN IS TO CONSTRUCT A LIGHTED HIGH BOARD RINK SOMEWHERE IN THE VICINITY OF THE SMALL WATER MANAGEMENT POND JUST NORTH OF CLUB CITADEL ADJACENT TO BOITREIL WAY.THE MUNICIPALITY HAS INDICATED THAT IF WE GET OUR ACT TOGETHER IN TIME THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO PROVIDE THE NECESSARY FUNDS AND RESOURCES. IF ANYONE IS INTERESTED IN HELPING PLEASE CONTACT ANY MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE.

OUR SECOND MAJOR CONCERN AT THIS TIME IS PREPARING A PLAN FOR OUR FIRST MAJOR PARK FACILITY. A SITE HAS TENTATIVELY BEEN IDENTIFIED, THAT BEING THE RECREATION SITE ENCIRCLED BY PRINCESS LOUISE DRIVE IMMEDIATELY SOUTH OF THE WATER MANAEMENT POND DIRECTLY ACROSS FROM BROOKRIDGE CRESCENT. THE OBJECTIVE IS TO HAVE A ROUGH DRAFT OF WHAT THIS NEIGHBOURHOOD WANTS IN ITS FIRST PARK BY END AUGUST AND OVER TO THE MUNICIPALITY ARCHITECT WHO WILL THEN DEVELOP A CONCEPTUAL DRAWING BY MID SEPTEMBER. THIS PROPOSAL WILL BE PRESENTED TO COUNCIL IN LATE SEPTEMBER OR EARLY OCTOBER.WE OUR OPTIMISTIC THAT OUR PARK WILL BE APPROVED AND FUNDED THIS FALL WITH CONSTRUCTION COMMENCING NEXT SPRING.REMEMBER THIS COMMITTEE IS CREATING THIS PARK BASED ON WHAT WE FEEL THIS COMMUNITY NEEDS AND WANTS SO IF YOU FEEL STRONGLY ABOUT A CERTAIN FACILITY PLEASE CONTACT SOMEONE ON THE COMMITTEE OR COME ON OUT AND HELP.

FALLINGBROOK VERSUS PINEBROOK

THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM YOU ON A PROPOSAL TO ADOPT THE NAME FALLINGBROOK FOR OUR ENTIRE COMMUNITY IN LIEU OF PINEBROOK. AS YOU MAY OR MAY NOT KNOW OUR COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION COVERS THE AREA BORDERED BY ST JOSEPH BLVD ON THE NORTH, 10TH LINE ROAD ON THE WEST, INNES ROAD ON THE SOUTH AND NAVAN ROAD ON THE EAST. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS ASSOCIATION IS TO ESTABLISH A COHESIVE COMMUNITY OF WHICH WE CAN BE PROUD AND WITH WHICH WE CAN READILY IDENTIFY. TO THIS END, IN OUR FIRST MEETING WE ELECTED TO ADOPT THE NAME PINEBROOK IN AN ATTEMPT TO ESTABLISH IMMEDIATE COHESION BETWEEN PINERIDGE AND FALLINGBROOK. UNFORTUNATELY THE COMMITTEE FEELS THIS NAME IS NOT CATCHING ON NOR DOES IT HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO CATCH ON. PEOPLE OUTSIDE THE COMMUNITY STILL REFER TO US, MOST OFTEN AS "EAST OF THE TENTH LINE" AND RECENTLY MORE FREQUENTLY AS THE FALLINGBROOK AREA. RECOGNIZING THIS, THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE VOTED IN FAVOUR OF A PROPOSAL TO RENAME OUR ENTIRE COMMUNITY AS FALLINGBROOK.

WHY FALLINGBROOK?

I THINK YOU WILL ALL AGREE FIRSTLY THAT IT IS A VERY PRETTY AND CLASSY NAME. WE CONTEND THAT IT IS ALSO VERY REPRESENTATIVE OF OUR AREA IN THAT ONE DOES SEE A FALLING BROOK AS ONE TURNS OFF ST JOSEPH BLVD ON ROUTE UP TO OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD. MOST IMPORTANT THOUGH WE FEEL THAT IN TIME THIS NAME STANDS A VERY GOOD CHANCE OF CATCHING ON. THERE ARE ALSO SOME WAYS THE COMMITTEE FEELS WE CAN ENHANCE THE RECOGNITION OF THIS NAME.

"ACTION TO ENHANCE THE NAME FALLINGBROOK"

IF THIS PROPOSAL IS ENDORSED BY YOU, OUR ASSOCIATION PLANS TO PURSUE TWO IMMEDIATE COURSES OF ACTION THAT WE FEEL WILL ALMOST ASSURE THE RECOGNITION OF THE FALLINGBROOK COMMUNITY. THE FIRST ACTION IS TO HAVE THE DEVELOPER OF THE PROPOSED IGA AND PLAZA AT THE CORNER OF CHARLEMAGNE AND 10TH LINE ROAD RENAME THIS PLAZA FROM QUEENSWOOD PLAZA TO FALLINGBROOK PLAZA. WE HAVE ALREADY INITIATED THIS REQUEST. THE SECOND ACTION IS TO PROPOSE THE RENAMING OF 10TH LINE ROAD (WHICH I KNOW MOST OF YOU DEPLORE) TO FALLINGBROOK ROAD (OR LANE/DRIVE/BLVD ETC). THERE ARE A FEW OTHER IDEAS WE HAVE TO FURTHER ENHANCE THE ENTRENCHMENT OF THE NAME FALLINGBROOK.

IF YOU HAVE STRONG FEELINGS TOWARDS THIS PROPOSAL, EITHER WAY, WE ASK YOU TO CALL OUR PRESIDENT, PETER MACNAMARA, AT 824-2148.

COMMUNITY MAILBOX UPDATE

Despite our objections, Canada Post has gone ahead and installed the community mail boxes in our neighbourhood. Nevertheless, we must continue to show to Canada Post and the Conservative Government that we oppose this form of mail delivery.

Fortunately, the support for door-to-door delivery is growing quickly. Representatives of this area met in June with citizens of Fisher Glen and Centre Point of Nepean.

As a result of this meeting, the following actions were discussed and implemented:

1. C.U.E.P.S. (CITIZENS UNITE FOR EQUITABLE POSTAL SERVICE) was formed and the objectives of the lobby group were defined;
2. letters expressing our disapproval were sent to all members of the House of Commons, including the Prime Minister;
3. letters were sent to 27 municipalities requesting the name of contact persons in those areas;
4. contact was made with the Council for the Disabled in an effort to gain their support;
5. the media was invited to meet with Cyril Keeper (NDP Critic for Canada Post), Mayor Clark, Councillors Casey and McDonnell (Cumberland) and Councillor Cantin (Gloucester) along with members of this community to protest Canada Post's plan to go ahead with the community mail boxes;
6. a meeting with Michel Coté, Minister Responsible for Canada Post, has been requested through Don Boudria's office (MP for Cumberland, Prescott & Russell);
7. a petition was presented to the House of Commons on July 24, 1986 by Don Boudria on behalf of the citizens of Club Citadelle;
8. the municipality of Nepean has taken Canada Post to Court over the constitutionality of the community boxes;
9. pamphlets printed by the Letter Carriers' Union are now being distributed to your home;
10. a three fold card prepared for C.U.E.P.S. is also being distributed to your home at the same time.

As a follow-up to the actions mentioned above, Members of Parliament are responding to our letter. The replies are being compiled and the information will be made available to you in the next newsletter. Several municipalities have already provided C.U.E.P.S. with contacts across Canada. These are presently being pursued in an effort to develop a National Plan of Action which could be implemented starting September 1986. Contacts have been identified in Quebec, Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta.

The Council for the Disabled has written a stern letter to Michel Coté condemning the use of community boxes.

Michel Coté has not yet responded to our request for a meeting, however, we will double our efforts as soon as the House resumes on September 8th.

Meanwhile, residents are asked to continue giving C.U.E.P.S. their support by signing and mailing the detachable cards inside the Letter Carriers' Union pamphlet. You are also asked to complete and mail the cards printed for C.U.E.P.S.

If you belong to a group or association such as the Arthritis Society, M.S., Heart Foundation, Senior Citizens Association, Association for the Blind, the Handicapped, the Lung Association, etc., please express your concern to the association and request that they write to Michel Coté and the Prime Minister to complain about this situation. At the same time, ask the association to forward a copy to C.U.E.P.S. for our records.

The Post Office has turned down the request to have our mailing address changed from Navan to Orleans. Canada Post's attitude is that once a boundary is set, it will not be changed, no matter what the reason. Their logic was something such as: If we (the Post Office) change it for you, then we will have to change it the next time a new development goes up. After all, according to the Post Office, no one is forcing us to live where we do.

This is obviously not acceptable. If the answer down the road continues to be "no", then we might have to live with that. However, the Post Office's reason will have to be far more substantial than "Because I said so."

Your Planning Committee continues to pursue bringing about this desired change.

"Consumer Beware" this is the message we are receiving from Canada Post when it comes to Priority Post mail delivery in this community.

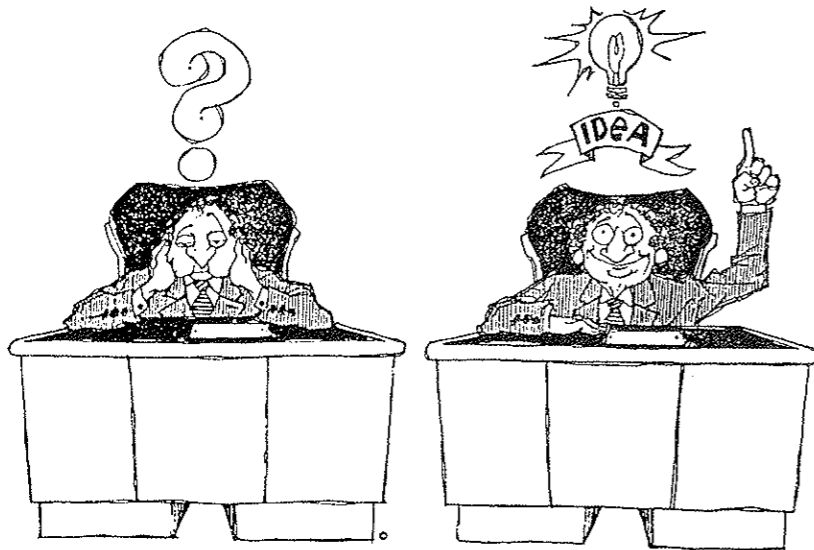
This area we were told is not entitled to Priority Post delivery because we are not serviced by a letter carrier. Our status of rural delivery not only creates confusion for businesses looking for Merkle Dr. in NAVAN but also excludes us from Priority Post delivery and prevents us from picking up registered mail at the Orleans sorting office. The NAVAN address also could lead to confusion whenever you may have to call for the police, the fire department or an ambulance.

You have received recently your keys to the new boxes along with change of address cards. The change of address cards will change your postal code only and does not change the city from NAVAN to ORLEANS as citizens have requested. As an objection to the NAVAN address, citizens are asked to retain these change of address cards until such time as representatives from this community meet with Michel Côté, Minister Responsible for Canada Post.

Your support is essential to pressure Canada Post to change our mailing address from NAVAN to ORLEANS. It's not just a matter of "Priority," it is also a matter of "Safety".

Let's pull together. Thank you.

EDUCATION

We have invited Carleton School Board Trustee, Frank Cauley, and Spencer Stanutz, Principal of Dunning Faubert Elementary School, to address us on the problems and plans for our area in the Public School system. We have also invited Carleton Separate School Board Trustee, Jerry Quesnel, to speak to the needs and plans of the Separate School situation.

Please note that this IMPORTANT MEETING on ISSUES IN EDUCATION will take place as follows:

Cairine Wilson H.S. is located just north of the Convent Glen Shopping Centre on Orleans Blvd.

One issue that is a major concern is overcrowding as our community continues to grow so rapidly. Travelling great distances by bus could become an increasing reality unless schools are built nearby. We have heard about plans for a Public High School to be built on the 10th Line. We have seen three sites set aside for elementary schools throughout the community, but specific information on when schools will be built, or what other plans are available, has been vague.

I therefore have talked to Dr. Khair, Director of Planning for the Carleton Board of Education, who is very aware of, and sympathetic to, our problems. He explained that his department submits its proposals to the Board of Trustees in the fall and, if they are approved, the process of funding and construction will take a minimum of 2 years.

I also talked to Trustee Frank Cauley and he expects that both schools will be presented and, hopefully, approved this fall. Mr. Cauley has asked our association to try to get an opinion from our community on whether we want a French Immersion Centre or Dual Track School for our elementary aged children. Our current French Immersion Centre, Dunning Faubert School, is becoming increasingly overcrowded with several portables added.

When a new elementary school is built, we can look forward to co-operation from the Carleton Board on planning the adjoining parks. Dr. Khair would be pleased if his department could become involved so that the best use could be made of both the school and park lands.

Whether the issues concerning your family relate to elementary or high school situations, we need you at this meeting on Sept. 16th. This will be your opportunity to ask questions and provide input on what kind of schools you want.

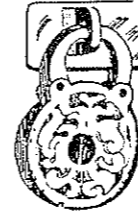

THEFTS OF \$12,550!
PROTECTING YOURSELF AND YOUR NEIGHBORS

On July 14, 1986 three occurrences in a range of two miles in or near the Pineridge/Fallingbrook Association, a total of \$12,550 worth of appliances, jewellery and electronic equipment was stolen from you or your neighbors.

To date, we have been fortunate east of the Tenth Line in that we haven't had a tremendous number of break-in or malicious damage problems. It is as inevitable as snow in December in Ottawa that we will face this in the near future.

A neighborhood such as ours with quality homes, attractive surroundings and relatively "up-scale" occupants will soon be an enticement to many petty and/or professional crooks.

The solution is the Protection of Yourself and Your Neighbors! This can be done most effectively by getting involved in our Neighborhood Watch program.

We have enclosed a map outlining the breakdown of our association showing which Neighborhood Watch person is responsible for your street

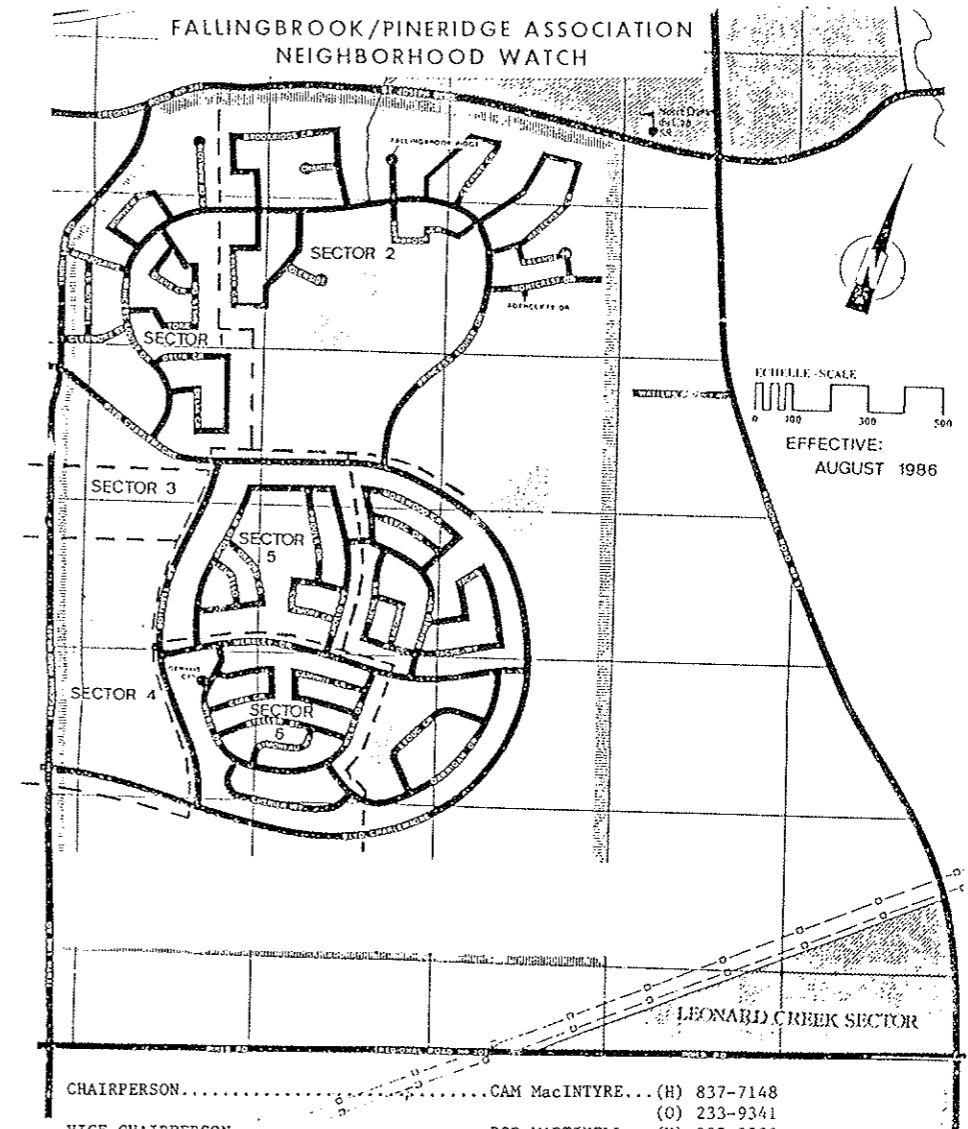
area. In addition, the names and contact phone numbers of the Chairman and Co-Chairman of our association are provided.

In the next month or two, you will be asked to get involved in Neighborhood Watch at various levels. The entire protection of our association members rests solely on each and every one of us and our willingness to commit to getting involved. A lack of involvement really is an open invitation to the negative element of our society to "pay us a visit". We need a strong united message that tells them to "take a hike" when they are considering breaking the law in the Pineridge/Fallingbrook area.

We are in desperate need of individuals who would be willing to lend a hand in talking with five to ten people about the program. Don't say "somebody else will do it". We need your help.

We will be holding an educational seminar for all of us at the Queenswood Heights Centre on September 29, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. Please plan to attend to obtain accurate information on "safe-proofing" your home/property without the usual sales-pitch that comes with it.

In conclusion, welcome back to the neighborhood if you've been on holidays or out of town. Take a moment to introduce yourself to both your neighbors and other people in our association. Let's make this a safe, friendly community that we can be proud of forever! It will only happen with your help.

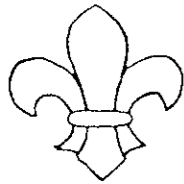
