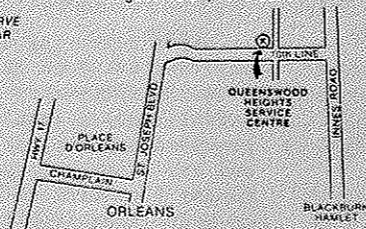

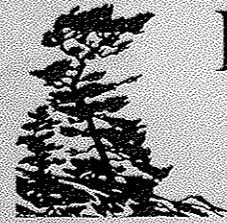

It has been a busy and productive summer for members on the recreation committee. Anyone who has been by the park site on Wilkie St. has seen some of the results. The landscaping and hydro-seeding is now complete and it is hoped that the playing fields will be in usable condition by next spring. We have submitted our preferred choice of play structures to council for approval, these include a tot lot near the ball diamond, a major play structure near or on the school property, a seventy foot long cable ride, and a number of free standing swings.

We made a submission to council on 1 Sept. to obtain funding for a high board rink to be placed on Bottreill in the same location as the temporary one last year. Council has given approval in principal and we are now awaiting more accurate cost estimates for the lighting. We would also like to locate a temporary rink in the north section of the neighbourhood and money will be requested for this in our annual maintenance budget submission. We have volunteers and a tentative site, the only unknown at this time is the funding.

The association, and in particular the recreation committee, would be interested in any ideas for projects and events that would encourage neighbourhood participation. We hope that over the next year many more people have an opportunity to become involved in neighbourhood activities. If you have an idea or would be willing to help organize things such as teen dances, ball tournaments etc., please contact any member of the committee.

NATURE TRAILS

Many people are unaware of the network of nature trails in the Fallingbrook area which offer the chance to "get away from it all" for a short time without having to travel far. These trails have been developed by volunteers and the township, and because they are situated on conservation lands, are open to everyone.

(A) The nearest trail runs along the top of the escarpment overlooking the Ottawa River valley. The best place to start is at the water management area north of Princess Louise Drive and west of Fallingbrook Court. Passing along the left side of the drainage area, you arrive at a deep chasm cut by a waterfall (this waterfall cannot be seen from St Joseph Blvd), which is especially spectacular in the spring.

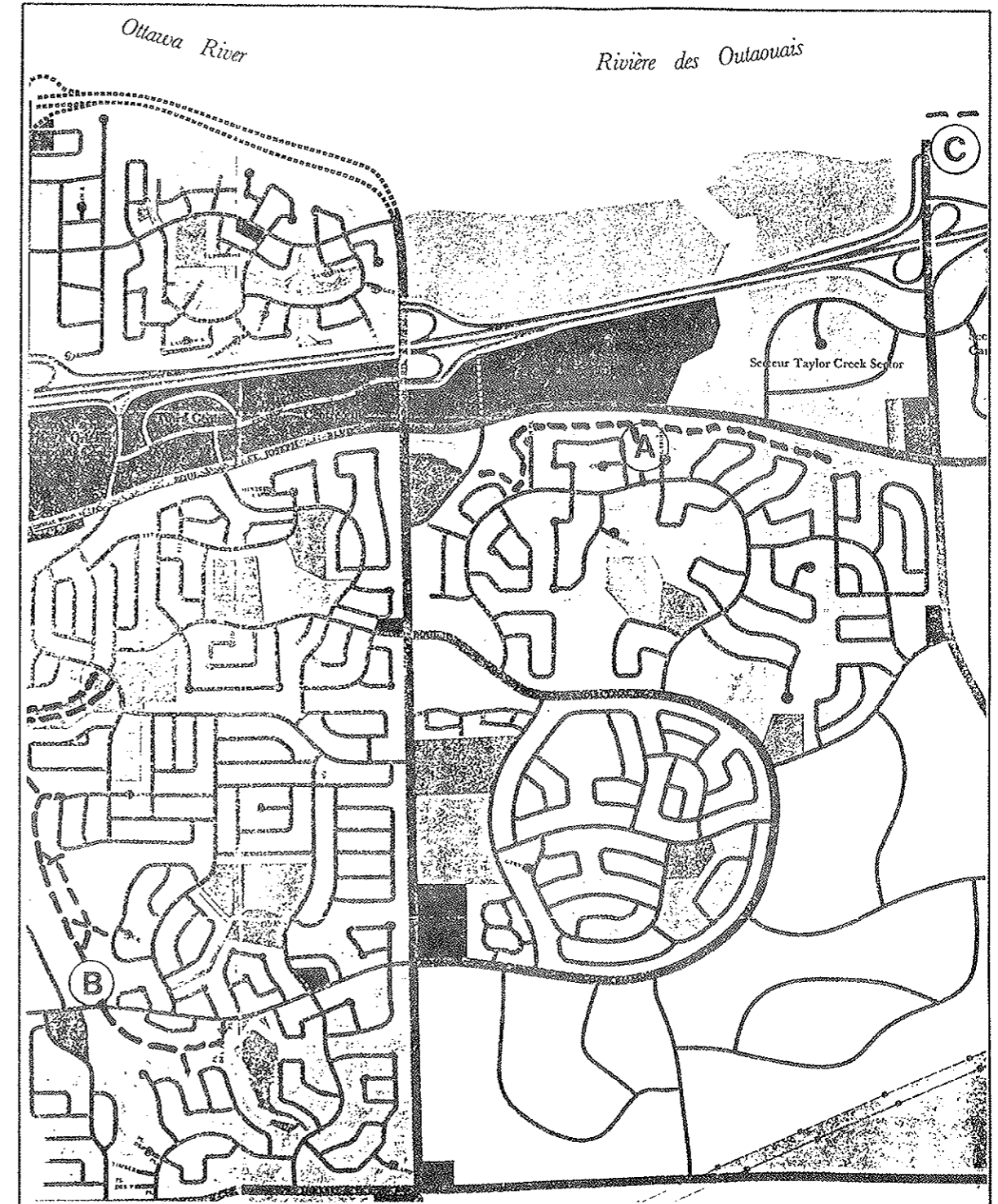
The trail goes both east and west at this point. The westerly one goes all the way to the hill overlooking Tenth Line Road, and in fact continues on the other side of Tenth Line. There are some places where it looks like the trail is passing through someone's backyard, but this is really conservation area, so don't let this stop you.

Going east, the trail is a bit harder going, and ends at the edge of the present development. This will be extended in future years.

(B) For a longer walk, the trails in the Bilberry Creek Ravine in Queenswood Heights take about an hour for the round trip. Bring boots unless it has been dry for some time, and insect repellent too depending on the season (these double as cross country ski trails in the winter). Although there are several entrances, I like to start at the west end of Wayside. Once inside the ravine, you are surrounded by trees and can imagine you are far from the city. There are a number of trails at various points, but try to follow the ravine north as far as you can.

(C) Petrie Island is reached by following Regional Road 57 across Highway 17. The far side of the island is a quarrying operation, but the near side at the first bridge has trails along both sides of the water. Various aquatic life, such as beavers, may be seen here. Insect repellent is essential during the summer.
