# Community News

## **Parked Cars on Charlemagne**

Are you irritated by one or two cars parked on the north leg of Charlemagne opposite Princess Louise Drive? Are you concerned about two lanes having to merge into one lane just where many cars are turning left? Have you seen a near-accident here? You are not alone.

The Township painted lines on Charlemagne last fall at the urging of the community association, finally turning it into a four-lane road. However they don't seem to be in a rush to prohibit parking on Fallingbrook's largest arterial road.

If you are concerned about cars parking on Charlemagne near Princess Louise, please phone your Councillors, Bob Monette (824-2822) and Frank Stacey (824-0828).

## **Traffic Lights on Queensway**

Your community association has pointed out that the traffic signals all the way from the Queensway into Fallingbrook are totally desynchronized during the afternoon rush hour. You have to stop at every single light, 100% of the time. A monkey could not have done a worse job at synchronization. In the morning the timing seems to be much better.

There are two levels of government responsible. The provincial Ministry of Transportation operates the signals on Hwy 17, whereas the Regional Municipality operates the others. So it may not be possible to synchronize those on Hwy 17 with those on St Joseph. But at least they can fix their own.

Officials expressed some surprise that the signals were mis-timed. My experience is that they will deny that there is any problem, then quietly fix things in a few months.

## **CBE School Delayed**

The Carleton Board of Education's second elementary school in Fallingbrook has been delayed because the new provincial government rejected its novel funding approach of leasing the school from a private developer for 20 years, then owning it outright.

The school, to be located just south of Watters Road, is now returned to the number one priority for the CBE, angering residents in Chapel Hill and Barrhaven whose schools were pushed down the list. The school was to open in September 1992, but will now be at least a year later than that.

## **Traffic on Charlemagne**

The Township is moving very slowly on installing crossing aids for children trying to get across Charlemagne, particularly the north part, in spite of the urging of the community association and local schools. Children attending Fallingbrook Community Elementary School from inside Charlemagne will have to be bused again next year, because Charlemagne is thought by school principal Richard Alton to be too dangerous for even grade 8 crossing guards.

The Township has contracted with the Region to study the road, and come up with suggestions. We propose a pedestrian operated traffic light at or near Charlemagne and Bottriell (north). We are opposed to stop signs or pedestrian crossovers because of safety issues. The Region is doing traffic counts at the corners of Charlemagne at Princess Louise, Charlemagne at Bottriell, and Bottriell at Merkeley, to determine if any changes are needed.

## Building Permits

If you are digging, you should verify that you will not cut any underground cables. The following utilities will mark your lawn with the location of the buried services, free of charge.

If you are doing indoor renovations which include electrical work, you should arrange for an inspection from Ontario Hydro (225-7600). The inspector will visit twice, first when the boxes and wires are in place and visible, and then when the wiring is complete. The inspectors seem to be very friendly, and will advise you if you are unsure. They will even correct mistakes for you if necessary. And they only look where you want them to look.

You may also require a building permit from the Township (830-6203) for indoor work and any outdoor structure larger than 100 square feet. The permit requires a \$200 performance deposit in addition to the fee. The inspectors tend to be more picky than the electrical inspectors - they found several things wrong that were done by the original builder in my house. And all work, including decks and sheds, must conform to the building code for houses.



## Nature Trails

Have you visited Fallingbrook's nature trails along the escarpment north of Princess Louise Drive? There are pathways leading to the trails from Brookridge, Cezanne, Hauteview and other streets. The trails now stretch from Tenth Line Road to Trim Road.

The highlight is always Princess Louise Falls, located between Brookridge and Falling Brook Place. You can reach the bottom of the falls by taking the trail down the escarpment about 200 meters west of the falls.

Queenswood Heights has an even better network of trails along the Bilberry Creek Ravine. The ravine can be seen where Des Epinettes goes down the long dip.

## Retiring Councillor

Linda Dunn, who has served as Councillor-at-large for the last 5 years, has decided to leave politics, at least for the present. Linda has been very active in many areas, being chairman of the powerful Planning Committee, but also is a strong advocate of environmental issues. She will be missed on Council next year.

## Champlain Interchange

The construction of a full interchange on Hwy 17 at Champlain St is well behind its original schedule. Excavation of the old Hwy 17 to allow traffic to pass underneath Champlain, will begin this fall, with completion in 1993. The Tenth Line Road ramps will not be begun until after this date.

## Dog Owners

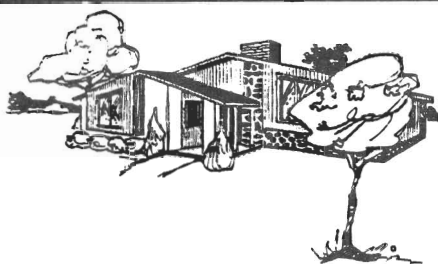
