## CANADA DAY '98: *Wet, but wonderful !!!*



Despite the heavy rain on the morning of July 1, the Fallingbrook Community Association pulled off its eleventh successful Canada Day celebration. Thousands attended the events during the day, and tens of thousands watched the newly-expanded fireworks show at night. Attendance at the amusement rides was up almost 80% over last year.

The site had to be re-arranged this year due to the construction of the new library. Most events were held in the open field near the Ray Friel Center, which unfortunately had many puddles. We hope that next year the grading of the field can be improved. Fireworks were fired over the football field at Sir Wilfrid Laurier Secondary School. The larger fireworks area permitted firing some larger shells, and many positive comments were received that the fireworks show was the best ever.

Without our valuable sponsors, this event would not be possible. Just about everything was provided free of charge to the participants, and the children were pleased to receive many free prizes at the Kids Olympics, the Childrens Fair, the Pet Show, the Decorated Bike Contest, and other events.

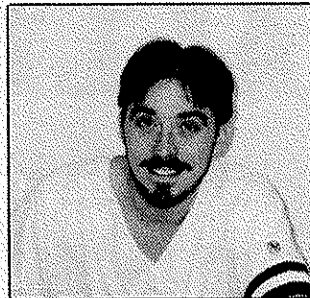

Library

The construction of our new Library has been delayed due to a labour stoppage during the summer. The new target date for the opening is mid to late February 1999. I take this opportunity to introduce the Friends of the Library who are community volunteers and dedicated supporters of the Cumberland Public Library.

The Friends of the Cumberland Public Library is a non-profit organization built around a group of volunteers who work in various ways to promote, improve and expand our library service. The group has been in existence since the fall of 1996 and has been working diligently to raise funds, raise public awareness and encourage the use of the library by the community.

In the Spring of 1998, the Friends joined together with the Weekly Journal newspaper and Place d'Orléans shopping centre to form a partnership to raise funds for the new Cumberland Public Library being built on Tenth Line Road beside the Ray Friel Centre. The Friends will have an important role to play in raising funds for books, CD-ROMs, CDs, reference material, etc. The goal is to try to make the new library a focal point for community access to information, education, and cultural enrichment. The Friends have been allocated space in the new library to carry out ongoing fundraising and promotion.

The Friends have been involved in several successful fundraising initiatives. The Spring and Fall Used Book Sales are always looked forward to as a source of great bargains for book lovers. Their most recent endeavour, a Children's Story Writing Contest, brought in submissions from some very talented young writers in our own community. The winning stories will be published in book form and all profits from sales of the book will go towards building the collection at the new library.

For Your INFORMATION

TAX NOTICE TO BUYERS OF NEWLY CONSTRUCTED HOMES:

When one buys a new home they are subject to paying PROPERTY or REALTY TAX. Property Taxes are composed of TWO principle taxes. FIRST there is the LAND TAX. Tax on the land is applied at the time of subdivision and is paid by the developer. At the time of signing your deed you will reimburse the developer for the land tax for the balance of the year(1998).- usually about 10%-20% of your total property tax. The following year (1999) you will receive an interim tax bill from the municipality for the LAND TAX, with Regional and School portions and sewer surcharges added. SECOND, there is what we call the HOUSE TAX. This portion of your tax is based on the amount of the purchase price of your house. Once you buy your house, the Regional Assessment office applies a Fair Market Value to your house. You receive a Notice of Assessment ( with an opportunity to appeal). This Notice of Assessment may arrive at your house anywhere from Six Months to Two Years after your closing date. The Notice of Assessment is also sent to the Municipality who will calculate the full amount of the FINAL REALTY TAX and provide you notice to pay your FULL tax bill within 21 days. If your notice of Assessment comes later, rather than earlier, you will be faced with paying a large amount of money within a very short period of time. New home buyers are advised to save for this inevitable event. Savings should be made at an annual amount calculated at 2% of the cost of your home.

BE ADVISED, that with the general reassessment this year the Regional Assessment office has not sent out any assessments in 1998. It is not anticipated that assessments will be sent out before February - March. In the past many residents have called me, shocked with having to pay \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 taxes within 21 days. Please, don't be one of them

If you pay your taxes with your mortgage ensure that the mortgage company is taking sufficient funds to cover the full tax. ( you may be entitled to an interest rebate for the monies that they have held prior to receiving the assessment)

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE SWIMMING POOL BY LAW:

Currently above ground pools must be set back FOUR METRES from the property line. In ground pools need only be placed 1.2 METRES from the property line. The Municipal Planning Advisory Committee has approved. In principle, the reduction of the ABOVE GROUND SET BACK TO 1.2 METRES, applying regulations equally to both types of pools. This reduction may cause some problems on certain corner lots by allowing an above ground pool to be adjacent to a neighbours front yard. Planning staff will report to Committee on October 13<sup>th</sup> with a final recommendation. The By-law amendment will then advertized for public input. Residents who plan to take advantage of fall pool sales should be aware of this change as it could affect the size of pool you buy and where you place it in your yard. The same by-law amendment also proposes minor changes to regulations affecting SHEDS, FENCES, AIR CONDITIONERS, SATELLITE DISHES, AND ANTENNAS. DID YOU KNOW, Cumberland allows clothes lines while Gloucester doe not !!!!!

NEW LIBRARY OPENING DELAYED

The opening of the new fully automated library has been delayed due to strike action by the steel workers earlier this spring. The New Library Committee, of which I am a member, is currently working with library staff to calculate the minimum time required to complete the change over from old to new. The new delivery date from the contractor is January 15.

Moving 65,000 volumes, adding 10,000 new volumes, setting up the automated procedures, and establishing and testing over 50 ON LINE COMPUTERS does not happen quickly. Originally scheduled to open on January 4<sup>th</sup>, the target date for the new opening is now FEBRUARY 15. The good news is that Christmas programming, cancelled by the original opening date, will be bigger and better than ever.

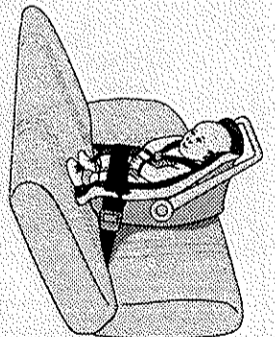

### FLASHBACK TO 1986

In September 1986, Fallingbrook had a population of about 2,800. Cumberland was the fastest growing municipality in Ontario. The only development was in the streets surrounding Apollo, Wilkie, and the west end of Princess Louise. There were no schools, no parks. What were the hot issues of 1986?

**Mailing address of Navan, Ontario:** For some reason the post office insisted that our mailing address should be Navan. This caused all types of confusion. In one case, a sick child was sent home from school by taxi -- to Navan. An ambulance was dispatched for a baby who had stopped breathing -- to Navan. Those who dared to use "Orleans" as an address had their mail defaced with "Navan Navan Navan". It would not be until several years later that the post office informed us that we had to start using the name Orleans.

**The name of Fallingbrook:** Today the area that we know as Fallingbrook is bounded by Tenth Line Road, Trim Road, St Joseph Blvd and Innes Road. In 1986 there were two main areas which the developers had named: Fallingbrook was in the area of Princess Louise, and Pine Ridge was in the area of Apollo and Wilkie. Initially a compromise name of "Pinebrook" was used, but eventually the name "Fallingbrook" was chosen. Attempts were made to have the name of Tenth Line Road changed to Fallingbrook Road.

**CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS FROM NAVAN TO ORLEANS**

The Post Office has turned down the request to have our mailing address changed from Navan to Orleans. Canada Post's attitude is that once a boundary is set, it will not be changed, no matter what the reason. Their logic was something such as: If we (the Post Office) change it for you, then we will have to change it the next time a new development goes up. After all, according to the Post Office, no one is forcing us to live where we do. This is obviously not acceptable. If the answer does indeed continue to be "no", then we might have to live with that. However, the Post Office's reason will have to be far more substantial than "because I said so."

Your Planning Committee continues to pursue bringing about this desired change.

**FALLINGBROOK VERSUS PINEBROOK**

THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM YOU ON A PROPOSAL TO ADOPT THE NAME FALLINGBROOK FOR OUR ENTIRE COMMUNITY IN LIEU OF PINEBROOK.

AS YOU MAY OR MAY NOT KNOW OUR COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION COVERS THE AREA BOUNDED BY ST JOSEPH BLVD ON THE NORTH, 10TH LINE ROAD ON THE WEST, TRIM ROAD ON THE SOUTH AND INNES ROAD ON THE EAST. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS ASSOCIATION IS TO ESTABLISH A CONSISTENT COMMUNITY OF WHICH WE CAN BE PROUD AND WITH WHICH WE CAN IDENTIFY. TO THIS END, IN OUR FIRST MEETING WE ELECTED TO ADOPT THE NAME FALLINGBROOK IN AN ATTEMPT TO ESTABLISH IMMEDIATE COHESION BETWEEN CUMBERLAND AND FALLINGBROOK. UNFORTUNATELY THE COMMUNITY FEELS THIS NAME IS NOT CATCHING ON NOR DOES IT HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO CATCH ON. PEOPLE OUTSIDE THE COMMUNITY STILL REFER TO US, MOST OFTEN AS "END OF THE TENTH LINE" AND RECENTLY MORE FREQUENTLY AS THE FALLINGBROOK AREA. RECOGNIZING THIS, THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RESPECTFULLY REQUESTS THAT YOU PLEASE ADVISE US OF YOUR OPINION ON THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY AS FALLINGBROOK.

**WHY FALLINGBROOK?**

I THINK YOU WILL ALL AGREE FIRSTLY THAT IT IS A VERY PRETTY AND CLASSY NAME. WE COULD SAY THAT IT IS ALSO VERY REPRESENTATIVE OF OUR AREA IN THAT ONE DOES NOT SEE A FALLING BROOK AS ONE TRAVELS OFF ST JOSEPH BLVD ON ROUTE 47 TO OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD. MOST IMPORTANTLY, I THINK WE FEEL THAT IN LIEU OF THIS NAME WE HAVE A VERY GOOD CHANCE OF CATCHING ON. THERE ARE ALSO SOME WAYS THE COMMUNITY FEELS WE CAN ENHANCE THE RECOGNITION OF THIS NAME.

**"ACTION TO ENHANCE THE NAME FALLINGBROOK"**

IF THIS PROPOSAL IS SHOWN BY YOU, OUR ASSOCIATION PLANS TO PERSIST AND IMMEDIATE COURSE OF ACTION THAT WE FEEL WILL ALREADY SECURE THE RECOGNITION OF THE FALLINGBROOK COMMUNITY. THE FIRST ACTION IS TO HAVE THE DEVELOPER OF THE PROPOSED 1000 AND 1100 PLAZA AT THE CORNER OF CHARLENGE AND 10TH LINE ROAD REMOVE THIS PLAZA FROM CUMBERLAND PLAZA TO FALLINGBROOK PLAZA. WE HAVE ALREADY INITIATED THIS REQUEST. THE SECOND ACTION IS TO PRODUCE THE REVISION OF 10TH LINE ROAD (WHICH I SHOW HERE IF YOU DEPEND) TO FALLINGBROOK ROAD (OR LAKE/DRIVE/BLVD ETC.). THERE ARE A FEW OTHER IDEAS WE WOULD LIKE TO FURTHER ENHANCE THE ENTIREMENT OF THE NAME FALLINGBROOK.

### Neighbourhood Watch

What is the Neighbourhood Watch Program?

The intent of the program is to prevent crime, and we all have that common goal of protecting our possessions.

The Neighbourhood Watch Program provides a coordinated effort against that crime.

The police requires 80% of our residences to be registered in order for the Neighbourhood Watch signs be installed at all streets entering Fallingbrook. These signs warn criminals that this community is an active crime fighter.

#### To register you we need:

- the name of one adult per household; and
- the home telephone number (indicate if 'unlisted').

#### \*\* NOTHING TO BUY \*\*

When a Street Captain visits you, he or she provides you with useful security information on how to improve your own security.

#### We need Street Captains:

We need many more Street Captains to cover the over 100 streets of our Community. Call me if you are interested.
