Planning Committee Report

Meeting with Mayor and Council

In February the community associations from Fallingbrook and Queenswood Heights met with Mayor Clark and most of the Councillors to discuss various issues. Here are some of the comments.

Roads. The Regional budget for new roads is considerably less than was anticipated. Not only will improvements like the Tenth Line interchange to Hwy 17 be delayed, but even work in progress such as the Blackburn Hamlet bypass will be set back.

Ray Friel Sportsplex. The news was quite encouraging. It is hoped that the first phase, comprising a swimming pool, will be completed by 1991. There was some perhaps overly optimistic indication that the adjoining public high school might be completed at the same time.

Finances. Mayor Clark gave a fairly detailed account of the various reserve funds held by the Township. He indicated that we are largely debt-free, except for some debentures to fund the industrial parks which will be self-funding. He said that Cumberland has long adopted the pay-as-you-go philosophy recently discovered by Gloucester, although he feels there are times when borrowing is justified. Tax increases will be slightly above the inflation rate again this year. However some time in the future, we will have to provide our own police force rather than use the OPP, in which case we can expect a tax increase as large as recently seen in Gloucester.

Municipal Representation. It was pointed out that our part of the urban area is under-represented on Township Council. Those of you who voted last November will recall that we have two "Heights Ward" representatives, Chatelaine Village has one, the rural area has two; plus everyone votes for one councillor-at-large and one mayor.

The table below summarizes how many thousand people are represented per councillor in each ward, with the columns on the right including the councillor-at-large and the mayor, respectively. It can be seen that Chatelaine Village has the highest representation, and the Heights ward the lowest. This might be alleviated by adding another councillor to the Heights ward, but Mayor Clark felt strongly that this is not a representation by population system, and that adding councillors will make Council unwieldy. But given that Fallingbrook's population will reach 25,000 in ten years, some changes are inevitable to avoid undue friction between the old rural and the increasingly urban parts of the Township.

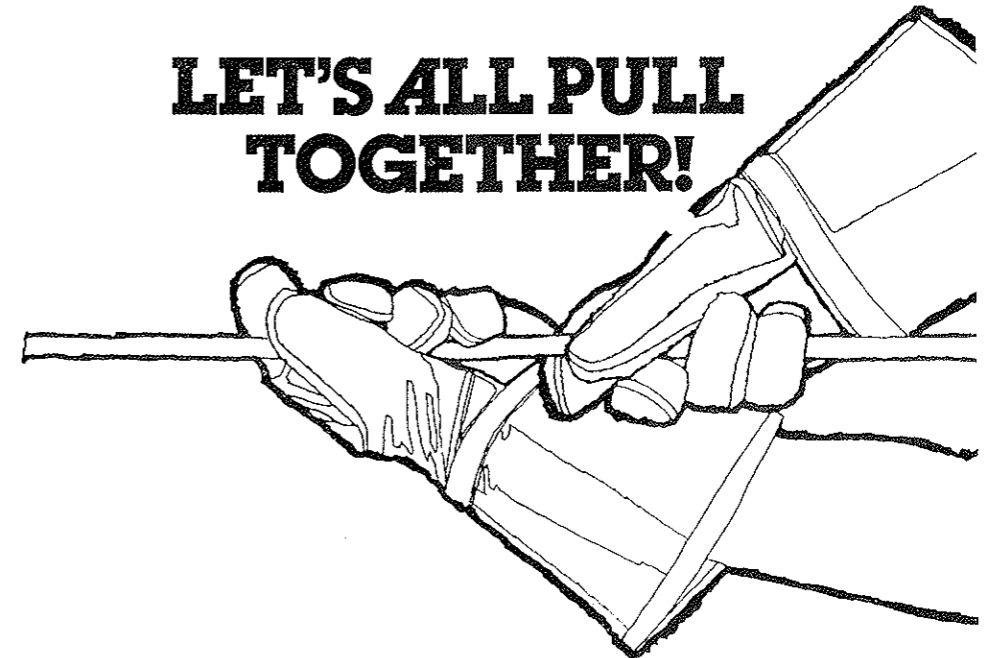
Hydro Rates

So you think that the Rural Rate Rebate on your hydro bill means that you're getting a good deal? Think again. Our electrical rates are the highest in the region. The table below shows the cost of 600 kWhr per month over a year, using the rates obtained in late January.

Gloucester Hydro	\$438
Nepean Hydro	\$483
Kanata Hydro	\$494
Goulburn Hydro	\$499
Ontario Hydro	\$532

The Ontario Hydro amount includes our so-called rebate. Cumberland Township is in the process of examining whether it would be economical to set up a Cumberland Hydro. It's hard to imagine how it could be more expensive than Ontario Hydro.

RINK REMARKS

So far this season has been splendid for our two community rinks. The weather and the efforts of many people have helped provide a couple of well commended ice surfaces. In addition to regular pleasure skating and hockey, the rinks have been used for several special events such as:

- skate-a-thon for the Fallingbrook School Age Day Care,
- skating party for the 40th Orleans Brownie Pack,
- various reserved hockey and broomball games.

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, the rinks are operated by the Fallingbrook Recreation Committee using a grant from Cumberland Township. Both the Bottriell and Fallingbrook School rinks are managed by volunteers. A considerable team of volunteers have assisted on a regular basis with nightly scrapings and floodings. The Fallingbrook School rink, having an incorporated skate change area, is also supervised by local students paid from the grant.

Anyone who donates their time toward the community deserves respect and recognition - especially when it may involve hanging on to the wet end of 200 feet of fire hose in minus 30. A big thanks goes out to this season's attendants and volunteers:

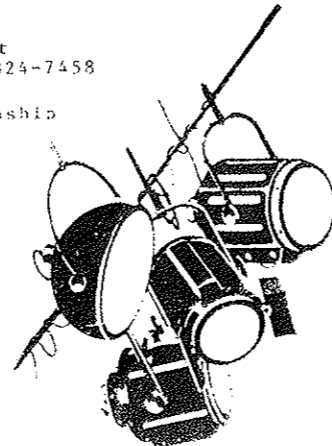
